

**PUBLIC HEARING OF THE VILLAGE OF ANGELICA BOARD OF TRUSTEES
INTRODUCTORY LOCAL LAW NO. 1 OF 2019, TO HEAR ALL PERSONS INTERESTED IN THE
MATTER OF A PROPOSED RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE ADOPTION OF ENTITLED "A LOCAL
LAW TO DECLARE A MORATORIUM ON DEVELOPMENT APPROVALS"
SEPTEMBER 30, 2019 - HELD AT THE ANGELICA GRANGE**

Mayor Trivisonoli called the Public Hearing to order at 7:00pm.

The Mayor explained how the proposed local law would operate and the reasons why the Board of Trustees is considering adopting it.

Opposed to adopting Local Law:

Christopher Geoppner – Not in favor of moratorium – nice community because no zoning laws – concerned on what this is going to cost the taxpayers – don't uphold currently property maintenance laws now on the books – concerned on how this is going to affect other business and residence – can't ask one to follow these rules and not others

William Weaver – Believe board is over stepping bounds – to have someone tell land owners what they can do or can't do on their property

Robin Robbins – not in favor of moratorium – concerned with how much money this is going to cost the taxpayers and inconvenience for community to get a building permit – with a big corporation it may cost in more ways than one

Those supporting the adopting of the Local Law:

Terri Ross – this move will better the village – not looking for zoning but to look at how the village can control some of the things in the future.

Brooke Bradt

An explanation of what the procedure is to get a building permit and who is granting the permit during the moratorium period – under Section 4. Administrative Relief from Moratorium of the Introductory Local Law explains the procedure.

David Haggstrom stated he sees it as a good thing to move forward on updating the Comprehensive Plan.

The mayor stated that this is not to stop any business from coming to the village- just brought a light to look into preserving and maintaining the village. Something in the future could come that could destroy the character of the village. The plan is to ask the community to volunteer to be on the committee/boards and be an advisory board to the Village Board of Trustees.

With no further questions asked the mayor declared the public hearing closed at 7:50pm – second Trustee Tylenda – Claypool-Aye, Perry-Aye, Tylenda-Aye, Haggstrom-Aye, Trivisonoli-Aye – carried.
