

**PUBLIC HEARING – POLICE REFORM PLANS - VILLAGE OF ANGELICA BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Mayor Trivisonoli called the public hearing to order at 7:00pm.

On June 12, 2020, Governor A. Cuomo issued executive order 203 directing municipalities that employ police officers to actively engage stakeholders in the local community and develop locally approved plans for the strategies, policies and procedures of local police agencies. The mayor stated how the Angelica Police Department serves the community and helps businesses. Feels the Angelica Police Department serves a great deed to the community and has good officers, and the department has never received any racial or sexual complaints. A questionnaire was sent to residents in the village and received 26 responses. Comments of the plan were also asked from the Allegany County District Attorney and Public Defender.

The mayor presented the plans for the strategies, policies and procedures of the Village Angelica Police Department. With no comments made the mayor closed the public hearing at 7:30 pm.
